HSC OP: 76.10, Animals in TTUHSC Buildings and on Grounds

PURPOSE: The purpose of this Health Sciences Center Operating Policy and Procedure

(HSC OP) isto definethe guidelines governing the presence of non-laboratory

animalsin TTUHSC buildings and grounds.

REVIEW: This HSCOP will be reviewed by September of every fourth year (E4Y) by

the Chief of Police, the Director of Student Disability Services, and Vice

President for Facilities and Safety Services wetcommendation for reversions forwarded to the Executive Viceresident of Finance and

Operations(EVPFO) by September 15.

POLICY/PROCEDURE:

All animals are prohibited from being kept, harbored, or maintained in any TTUHSC building or grounds with the exception laboratoryanimals police K-9's, or qualified service animal sutilized for or by persons with disabilities animals enrolled in the institution's Animal Therapy Program for approved events following the Americans with Disabilities Act, "Service animals are defined as dogs individually trained to do work or perform tasks for people with disabilitian taxamples of such work or tasks include guiding people who are blind, alerting people who are deaf, pulling a wheelchair, alerting and protecting a person who is having a seizure, reminding a person with mental illness to take prescribed medications, calming a person with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) during an anxiety attack, or performing other duties. Service animals are working animals, not pets the work or task a dog has been trained to provide must be directly related to the person's diability. Dogs whose sole function is to provide comfort or emotional support do not qualify as service animals under the ADA."
