HSC 0P: 10. Regulations for the arrying of concealed handguns by license holders

DATE: Effective August 01, 2016

- 1. **Definitions**:

- a. Campus all land and buildings owned or leased by TTUHS Greas les
- b. <u>Premises</u> a building or portion of a building
- C. <u>Handgun license holder</u> is an individuadensed to camy handgun under Texas Government Code Chapter 411, Subchapter H Such an eligible individual must be at least 21 years of age, not have a criminal record as defined by the code, and meet certain education and proficiency requirements. License to Chamdygun (LTC) is the new state designation which replaces the designation of Concealed Handgun License (CH). Individuals who hold a valid CHL may continue to carry with a valid existing license.
- d. Conceal ed handgorn is listed as radioactive in the special hazard according additional lyany labs using or storing biohazardous agents or toxins. The term also includes any laboratory for which federal law, licensing agreements, or a contractual research agreement precludes the presence of firearms.

f. <u>Designated medical service areas</u> This includes cl,iwhics are premises where patients receive healthare services and mental health services from a licensed/coeftifi health care professional

2. Statutory Al l owance:

- a. As authorized by Sec. 411. 2031, Government Code, and effective August 1, 2016, handgun license holders (CHL or LTC) are allowed, (except where reasonably prohibited by university rules), to carry on their person a contambglued on TTUHSC premises/campuses without violating state law.
- b. ROTC/Color Guard Firearms may be used on TTUHSC campuses for use in ROTC and Color Guard related events.
- c. As authorized by Sec. 411. 2031, Government <u>Ctolde</u>, unointegrate ity presidentwith approval of the Board of Regenterary establishoncealed carry restricted areas. This excludes any individual, group or faction within the university from formulating personalized rules for regulating or excluding handguns.

3. General prohibition:

a. Open display of a handgun Per Penal Code Sections 46. O33/O and 60%, open display of a handgun in plain view of another person on a TTUHSC campus is never allowed except by an authorized individual uch as a peace offichier, in the actual discharge of his ordney.
