

War, Disaster, & Death: Managing Complex Emergencies

Andrea (Andi) Tenner, MD, MPH, FACEP is an Assistant Professor of Emergency Medicine at the University of California, San Francisco. She has been working as a core faculty member for the new emergency medicine residency program at Muhimbili National Hospital in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania, and helped to develop the curriculum for this program. She is board certified in both emergency medicine and internal medicine and has a Masters in public health with a focus on forced migration as well as a certificate from the American Society for Tropical Health and Hygiene in tropical infectious disease (CTropMed®).
