Course Description: This course is intended to provide a comprehensive overview of the concepts and methods of conducting research in basic science and clinical settings. This course will also include material over preparing and presenting scientific research. Students will be introduced to the concepts and methods of project development, literature search, and institutional review board (IRB) basics. Students will also be familiarized with statistical analysis tools, generation of a manuscript and poster presentation. Students will have the opportunity to attend poster presentations. At the end of this course, students will have the knowledge and tools to efficiently plan and present research.

Prerequisite: Enrollment in MSI/II curriculum Maximum number of students: 100

Location: Didactic Sessions will be <u>held in-</u> for the entire 2022-2023 school year. Workshops will be held in-person, in rooms reserved on campus as needed.

Course Objectives and Expected Learning Outcomes:

1. Conduct basic principles of research as defined in the course description

2. Create relationships with various research mentors from the TTUHSC faculty

3. Adequately transition into TTUHSC research events such as the Student Research Week and Summer Research Program

Required Text: This will be a lecture-based course, and there will be no outside material required.

Attendance: Students are required to attend 9 out of 12 didactic lectures/ workshops.

Grading: This course will be graded on a pass/fail basis. Students are required to meet the attendance requirements & fulfill at least one of the following:

1. Attend student research week and provide feedback on a total of 3 presentations.

2. Apply for and present at student research week

3. Submit an application to the medical student summer research program (MSSRP).
