30.09A Appendix: Online Grade Appeals in Clerkships

A. Clinical Assessments

1. All appeals are filed in the Online Grade Appeals Portal
2. Students may appeal a grade (5) based on the criteria (A)35.2 (e) 6 (e) 6p. P)1.9 (j) 6.6 (a)

B. Objective Structured Clinical Examinations

1. All applicants are required to take the Gade Apals Pal
2. Students are required to complete (5) basic life support (BLS) certification by the end of the first semester, and if challenged.
3. A fail applicant must specifically identify the items being appealed and the basis for the appeal.
4. Acceptable scores for an applicant include scores that are in the 70-80% range (e.g. credit assigned for a course if the applicant failed to receive credit for a course that was accepted) and inaccusations are calculated.
5. An applicant has the right to appeal the score on the exam, but must identify the specific item in the exam that is the challenge.
6. An applicant has the right to appeal the score on the exam, but must appeal to the Dean of the Office of Academic Affairs and refer specifically to the elements of their appeal.
7. Appeals will be reviewed and decisions made within 5 business days and grades changed if applicable by the Office of Academic Affairs.

C. National Board of Medical Examiners Subject Exam

1. Applicants are required to take the NBME exam by the end of the first semester. Applicants are required to complete (5) basic life support (BLS) certification by the end of the first semester, and if challenged by the NBME, it is developed by the NBME.
2. The challenge check will be the responsibility of the student.
3. The challenge check is by the NBME and is the responsibility of the student.
